Netheravon Parish Council News from 3rd October meeting

The Chairman, Cllr Ayling thanked the Cheerful Cuppa for their very generous donation to the Newsletter. He also thanked the resident who has been litter picking at the Corfe, it is appreciated. The Netheravon in Bloom awards were presented before the meeting.



Planning

There was a planning application for Highview Farm Buildings, Enford and Netheravon held a joint meeting with 25 members of the public in attendance on 24th September. There were nearly all objections with concerns about the A345 and the danger of getting out on a 50 mph speed limit. Also, the effect on site of special scientific interest and Special Protection area and the effect the development would have on the river etc. All comments were recorded and response put on line before the deadline at the beginning of October.

Netheravon Parish Council

Recreation

School Close Play Area - The Council met with the Rural Parks and agreed in principle to take over this space. This is ongoing and if it does go ahead there will be public consultation on best use of the space.

Highways

The Council met with the Highways representative from Wiltshire County Council regarding some of the issues within the village, blocked gullies, broken pavements, flooding etc. There was a good response and some of the gullies have already been cleared, with other problems being sorted out in time.

Flooding and Adverse Weather

Increase in rainfall and signs have been put out, Chairman thanked Councilor's Brown and Burke for completing this.

Vandalism at the BMX track

There have been reports of vandalism at the BMX track, Chair thanked the resident who has agreed to litter pick up there, the Council decided not to invest anymore time/money into this amenity at the moment. We really need the young people who use this space to take some responsibility for the use of it.

Netheravon Speed Watch Group

The Netheravon Speed reduction trial finishes in November, we may not have the results straight away Cllr Mackay reported that we have Enford's camera for a couple of weeks too. Chair said thank you to everyone for their efforts, especially the resident who co-ordinates it all.

Community Allotment

All going well and still supplying the larder with fresh produce. The Chairman wanted to thank Julian Lamont for his very kind donations of fertilizer these last 2 years, it is really appreciated.

JULIA'S HOUSE CHRISTMAS SHOEBAG APPEAL

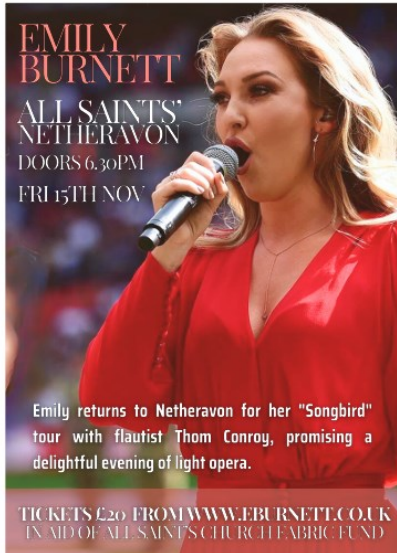

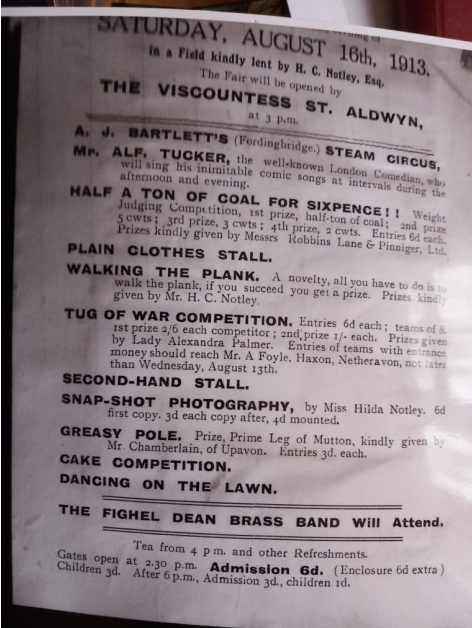

Report from PC Kinge and PCSO Kaur



We just want to remind you of a few simple steps you can take to keep your home and property safe.

Here's how you can safeguard your home:

Lock Up: Always lock your doors and windows when leaving the house, even if it's just for a short period. Don't forget about outbuildings and garages.

Lighting: Install exterior lighting, especially motion sensor lights, to deter unwanted visitors. Keep your home well-lit at night, both inside and outside.

Security Systems: Consider installing a visible alarm system or CCTV to act as a deterrent. Even dummy cameras can make burglars think twice.

Make It Look Occupied: When away, use timers on lights or ask a trusted neighbour to keep an eye on your property. A home that looks lived-in is less likely to be targeted.

Keep Keys Safe: Avoid leaving spare keys in obvious places like under mats or plant pots. Instead, give a spare to a trusted friend or neighbour.

Stay Vigilant: Report any suspicious activity in your neighbourhood to the police. If you see something unusual, don't hesitate to reach out.

Wiltshire Police is urging anyone who has concerns about the safety of public places in their area to report it via a dedicated service.

StreetSafe allows people to report any issues like poorly lit streets, abandoned buildings, or vandalism, as well as instances where they feel unsafe due to someone following or verbally abusing them.

This is completely anonymous and takes no more than a couple of minutes.

By completing the report police can target the main areas of concern and work with partners to make the county a safer place to live.

StreetSafe is also one of the many initiatives being used to help the police prioritise our ongoing work to reduce Violence Against Women and Girls, reduce incidents of violence and intimidation and make people feel safe on our streets.

PC Lisa Draper, Neighbourhood Harm Reduction Unit, said: "We want everyone living and working in our county to feel safe. However, the police cannot do it alone – we need the public's help in identifying where the areas of concern are so we, along with our partners, can do something about it.

"A dark alleyway due to a broken street light, a dilapidated building or overgrown shrubbery causing a blind spot on a pavement – these are all examples of things which can make people feel unsafe in their community. And these are all examples of things we want reporting."

Safer Streets funding has already been used to improve CCTV and lighting in parts of Swindon, Chippenham and Salisbury and it's also been used to provide night-time economy wardens in Salisbury and Trowbridge on Friday and Saturday evenings.

More funding

Police and Crime Commissioner Philip Wilkinson said: "Since 2022, my office has successfully bid directly, or support bids for over £3.4M of Safer Streets funding to be invested in Wiltshire and Swindon.

"This has been used to tackle neighbourhood crime, such as burglary, robbery, theft and vehicle theft, as well as reducing violence against women and girls.

"In addition to this, my office also successfully bid for £1M of anti-social behaviour (ASB) hotspot funding to increase patrols in the areas worst hit by ASB.

"There may be areas where statistics will tell us they are safe, but there's a world of difference between *being* safe and *feeling* safe.

"The data we obtain from StreetSafe will help us to target those areas where communities may feel vulnerable, by allowing them to tell us about the issues making them feel threatened."

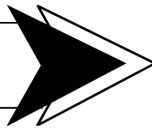

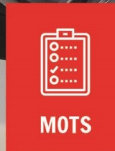
