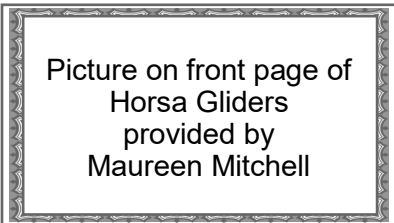

A word from Rev Philip Bromiley, our Team Rector.



VE Day

The 8th May sees the 80th anniversary commemoration of VE Day. **What did one soldier say to the other on VE Day?** “We came, we saw, we *conga’d!*” The celebrations were legendary and lived long in the memory.

The anniversary comes at a timely moment in history, as we reflect on a context where there is currently a war raging in Europe and peace is a truly fragile commodity. There are over a hundred conflicts worldwide going on now! Will we ever learn?

There’s a favourite phrase in our house... it’s not the taking part that counts, but the winning! The importance of VE Day isn’t just an excuse to be patriotic, but a cause of reflection. Imagine if we hadn’t won? What would the future of Nazism have brought to Jews and minority groups who survived the hatred of holocaust? How many more innocent lives would have been taken?

Victory came at a huge cost. The suffering and sacrifice of so many is, of course, a clear echo of the great meta-narrative of Christianity. For Victory to come over the powers of sin and death, it required the ultimate sacrifice of God Himself, becoming human, suffering, dying and then rising to new life. We live after the event and so hope is possible. The sheer relief and the coming together of so many on VE Day must surely inspire us to work together for peace and unity in a world that seems so fractured.

The Chairman welcomed everyone to the meeting and announced that we have a full council going forward, with 10 people standing as councillors, so no need for an election. He thanked the working party and the allotment volunteers for planting the fruit trees. All are in now and the Community allotment is looking stunning, thank you to the volunteers who help each week. Thank you also to our Duke of Edinburgh volunteer for coming up to help.

Police Report

Report received and sent out before the meeting, No major problems at the moment in Netheravon, our PCSO often comes to Cheerful Cuppa if anyone has any concerns.

Planning

Just one planning application for some tree cutting at Vicarage Gardens, council will have a site visit before comments sent back to Wiltshire Council.

Phoenix Hall Chairmans report

End of year report.

We completed last year with a bookings total of 18% increase. It looks like we made a surplus of £2570 this year. (Prior to Audit) Expenditure will increase over the next few months as some maintenance is required.

Maintenance and Improvements

The fire exit signs have been repaired or replaced.

Work on the front entrance has been started, thanks to some of the committee members however this showed that there will be a requirement for some fence repairs.

We are required to have a full fire risk assessment which has been booked for the 29th of May. This may result in some further actions to comply with the current regulations.

D Day

During 1943 the RAF underwent a period of reorganisation. Army Co-operation Command was disbanded, and the Tactical Air Force was formed as part of preparations for the assault on mainland Europe (D-Day). The invasion of Sicily had revealed the need for improved planning and training for airborne operations and 38 Wing was

upgraded to 38 Group RAF and the frequency and scale of exercises increased (one involved a night landing of some 90 - 100 Horsa gliders). A series of parachute servicing units were stationed at Netheravon and the base became heavily involved in preparing Horsa and Hamilcar glider for the invasion. As the build up gathered pace, there was a huge increase in the number of men and equipment to be housed on the airfield and at least 17 temporary accommodation blocks were built to the north of the main aircraft hangers.

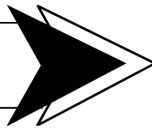
