Cllr Burke welcomed everyone to the meeting and hoped they had a good Christmas holiday. He thanked Cllr Mackay for once again doing the reading at the Village carol concert. He also thanked the Team for putting up the Christmas tree in the rain and for taking it down again. Thanks to Pam Panther for making the lovely presents and to the Village Handyman for his help with building bases to stop them blowing away. Thanks go to the Village Handyman for all the other jobs he has been doing over the last couple of months. He is an asset to the village and big thanks sent. Thank you also to resident of Queensway for spreading grit in bad weather recently – chair will check the bins are full.

### **REPORT BY WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR – none to report this month**

#### **Police Report**

Received and sent out before the meeting. Two thefts reported from the Village shop.

### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

1. **Planning** – Since the last Parish Council meeting there has been one new item for the planning committee to consider. PL/2025/08993 – 116 High Street – Tree Works in a conservation area. NPC supported with no objections.
2. **Flooding & Adverse Weather**– It has been noticed that since they worked on the drains at the bottom of the High Street it is not flooding, so hopefully that will continue. Flooding at Staggs Lane, Vice Chair still to speak to the homeowner, to request removal of the sandbags.
3. **Highways plus Parish Steward**– Cllr Covil and Cllr Mackay are aware of potholes in Old Post Office Lane and hopefully these will be getting done in January's round. Post meeting note -Potholes by Kings Hill (reported on MyWilts website).
4. **Recreation**- work is being carried out from the ROSPA reports by the Handyman, also Clerk and Chair had a meeting with Sovereign Play and are waiting for a quote for the broken piece of log trail equipment.
5. **Old School Close** – Clerk read out the belated response from a resident, and it was discussed about the public meeting on the 15<sup>th</sup> January in the Phoenix Hall at 6 pm. Will put notes through the resident's doors to remind them.
6. **Allotments**- Letter read out from a resident who wants to give up his allotment. This is on the site opposite the Dog and Gun and is the plot nearest the water tap. Clerk to advertise in the newsletter.

7. **Community Allotment and Community Larder.** Community allotment have been asked if they need anything to come to the council. Larder well stocked and going well.
7. **Rights of way:** Nothing to report.
8. **Representatives on other groups:**
  - a. **Phoenix Hall** - Our expenditure has increased over the last few months due to a large electricity bill.

### **Maintenance and Improvements**

The management committee are very grateful to the Village Handyman who has replaced one tap in the Gents toilet and repaired all the broken chairs in the main hall and committee room. He has also moved the letter box outside to be used for the village newsletter, parish council and Phoenix Hall mail.

### **Looking ahead**

The hall now has bookings for most days and as always, we are grateful for the support of our regular hirers.

We continue to advertise in our village's local newsletter.

- b. **Jubilee Committee** – Nothing new to report, curry lunch in the working man's club for Remembrance Day was a huge success.
- c. **All school liaison** – Cllr Bridewell said that the poppy laying ceremony with the children went very well, with the representative from the church giving the children a very interesting talk. He reported that the school hedge had been cut back, as it is at the same time every year as part of their maintenance tasks. We have a new vicar that has moved into the vicarage with his family.
- d. **Netheravon Speed watch Group** – There have been 4 outings from the team so far this year with the call for more volunteers needed. There was also discussion on moving the camera further up the road towards the 40 MPH sign. Clerk to put something in the newsletter
- e. **Newsletters** – Resident to talk to RGV regarding scanning and digitising the old Newsletters. The current Newsletter is ok financially for the next 3 months and is grateful for all donations.

## **7. GENERAL PARISH MATTERS**

Problems with the defibrillator being not rescue ready outside the village shop. The light is not working. RGV aware and is being investigated. Thanks go to the village shop team for taking it inside to keep it warm when they are open.

## History of Fittleton Church

Both Fittleton and Netheravon churches are dedicated to “All Saints”, as are half the churches in the Avon Deanery.

Fittleton church, first mentioned in records of 1291, is built of flint and rubble, mostly rendered, and has a chancel, aisled nave and south porch. The tower has a spire with a cockerel on top. The earliest identifiable parts of the building, the chancel arch and the bowl of the font, date to the early 13<sup>th</sup> Century.

The church has always been closely linked with the ownership of the manor and the right to appoint the clergy (the advowson) has been conveyed alongside it. In 1721 it was sold to Magdalen College, Oxford, and in 1947 transferred to the Bishop of Salisbury. The college provided a number of Rectors of the parish. (A Rector is in charge of a self-supporting parish; a vicar is in charge of a parish supported financially from the outside, as with Netheravon).

There have been alterations to the church over the years partly due to changes in religious rites, enlargements, and new windows being inserted. Magdalen College paid for repairs to the church and a new window in the north aisle in 1841 and in 1857 two windows from the College Chapel were given to the Rector Thomas Pearse, a fellow of Magdalen, and inserted in the west wall of the tower. Pearse paid for the restoration of the nave in 1878. His widow, together with the college, paid for further restoration in 1903 (and see the bells below). The architect then was C.E. Ponting of Marlborough who restored many churches in the area, including Netheravon.

## PROTECT YOUR HOME

If you work in the evening leaving your home empty, please consider taking these steps to secure your home from burglars.

- In almost one third of burglaries, thieves gain access through an open window or door. **Make sure doors and windows are locked.**
- Leave a light on** - use timer switches (available from most DIY stores) to make lights, radios and other appliances come on while you're out.
- Use a burglar alarm** if you have one or consider getting one fitted - ensure a visible alarm box is attached outside of your home.
- Lock side gates** and make sure garden tools, ladders or anything else that a burglar could use are locked away securely.
- Fit security lighting** outside your property.

## PROTECT YOUR HOME

- Never leave a spare key in a hiding place.** Keep keys out of sight and out of reach from windows and letterboxes.
- Don't keep large amounts of cash at home** - it is much safer in a bank or building society.
- Register **serial numbers from electrical items** with Immobilise.com the free national property register.
- Mark items without a serial number with an **artificial DNA property marker** such as Smartwater or SelectaDNA.
- Make sure you have up-to-date and proper **insurance cover**, especially for valuable items.
- Report any suspicious activity** to the police - online: [www.wiltshire.police.uk](http://www.wiltshire.police.uk), or call 101, or 999 in an emergency.

Also, an update for last month about speed Checks in Netheravon: Speed enforcement session carried out Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2025, between – 08:10 and 08:55, at *Netheravon*, 1 vehicle has been issued with notices of Intended prosecution for excessive speeding.

The roads monitored are 40 MPH and the fastest vehicle was captured at 53 MPH

Depending on previous convictions and history

- 1 Driver will be offered a speed awareness course.
- 0 Drivers will face £100 fine and get 3 Points.
- 0 Drivers Will be summoned to court.

Proceedings will now be undertaken to ensure the most appropriate outcome for the offenders takes place, which includes checking for MOT, Insurance & Point Totters.

Captured footage will be analysed for other offences like seat belts and mobile phone use.

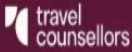

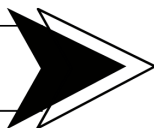
